

THE SUPERINTENDENCY OF BANKS

ANNOUNCES:

By virtue of the provisions of Article 31 of Decree Law 9 dated 26 February 1998, the Superintendency of Banks is authorized to enter into agreements and understandings with Foreign Supervisory Bodies to permit Consolidated Supervision and to ensure the relations with those Bodies are based on the principles of reciprocity and confidentiality, and strictly adhere to the purposes of Banking Supervision;

Pursuant to the provisions in Paragraph 29 of Article 17 of Decree Law 9 dated 26 February 1998, the Superintendent is authorized to establish cooperative links with Foreign Supervisory Bodies to strengthen control mechanisms, update preventive regulations and exchange information that is beneficial for the exercise of supervisory functions;

At the same time, Rule 4-98 dated 7 October 1998, establishes the framework for celebrating and executing agreements and understandings with Foreign Supervisory Bodies under the principles of reciprocity, relevance, national treatment, and confidentiality.

Based on the above norms and taking into consideration the importance of establishing cooperative structures for preventing and combating money laundering, as of this date the Superintendency of Banks has entered into Memorandums of Understanding with the following Banking Regulatory Bodies to facilitate consolidated supervision:
