CONSIDERING:

That **BANISTMO**, **S.A.** is a bank authorized to engage in the banking business in and from the Republic of Panama under a General License granted by means of Resolution SBP 187-2004 dated 2 July 2004;

That by means of Resolution SBP 84-2010 dated 9 April 2010 the Superintendency authorized **BANISTMO**, **S.A.** [formerly known as HSBC Bank (Panamá), S.A.] to establish a Representative Office in the Bolivarian Republic of Venezuela;

That, through its Resident Agent and based on Paragraph 2 of Article 58 of the Banking Law, **BANISTMO**, **S.A.** has requested the Superintendency authorize it to close the Representative Office the bank currently has in the Bolivarian Republic of Venezuela;

That pursuant to the provisions of Subparagraph 2, Paragraph I of Article 16 of the Banking Law, the Superintendent of Banks is the approving authority for closing banking establishments, and;

That after the relevant analysis the request submitted by **BANISTMO**, **S.A.** raises no objections.

RESOLVES:

To authorize **BANISTMO**, **S.A.** to close its Representative office currently located in the Bolivarian Republic of Venezuela.

LEGAL GROUNDS: Article 58, Paragraph 2 and Article 16, Paragraph I, Subparagraph 2 of the Banking Law.
